Safety Tips:

- Meet ALL Prospects (buyer and seller) in the office prior to showings.
- I use this meeting to pre-qualify for motivation and financials, but safety is also a factor.
- Get a copy of the buyer or seller's driver's license, and write down their license plate number.
- Determine who will attend all showings-- "Mr. Prospective Buyer, who will be attending showings with you?"
- Get a copy of their driver's license too.
- Avoid the pitfall of arriving and there being extra "friends" at the property.
- Arrive At The Showing Early.
- Enter the home, then lock the door behind you.
- If something does not feel right, don't open the door. Trust your instincts!
- Keep The Client in Front Of You-- This allows you to keep an eye on the person at all times.
- Hold your Keys in your hand--Naturally your pepper spray is on your key chain.
- Travel In Pairs-- There is nothing wrong with bringing another agent with you to home showings.
